## Living Expenses During Your First Year of University/College

The information below is designed as a guide to help you budget your living expenses at university / college during your first year. You will be able to calculate your own personal budget once you know your outgoings.

## Start-up costs

Don't forget that there are certain things you'll need to buy when you start university/college, as these won't be provided by your accommodation. They include:

- Bedding (sheets, pillows, duvets)
- Towels and tea towels
- Cups, bowls and plates
- Cutlery
- Cooking utensils and saucepans.

You may just want to bring the bare minimum of kitchen equipment, cutlery and crockery when you start university, as you and your housemates may decide to buy some of the essentials together and split the cost.

## Accommodation costs

In addition to the living costs for year 1 noted above, you will also need funds to secure your accommodation for the following year. This will include a holding fee, deposit and first month's rent which can average £800-£1,000. Some students will wait until after Christmas to secure their accommodation as they will have more funds available.

Many letting agents also require you to have a guarantor. If your family have a low income, do not own their own home or you're an EU or international students you may find it difficult to get a guarantor. There are companies that can act as your guarantor for a flat rate fee of approximately £300, or a fee of approximately 3.5% of the total rent. If the letting agent doesn't accept these companies as a guarantor then the other options include paying 6 months or the full contractual rent upfront.
